REMINDER: We are currently planning to meet with Michael Petrovick to discuss the Town Hall project on 4/23 at 4:30 p.m.

Most of my time this week was spent working on the Mooseplate Grant Application for the Town Clock restoration, which is due on the 25th. Phil D'Avanza came out on Wednesday to review the condition of the clock and help me take some pictures from inside that help demonstrate its current condition. He also made some revisions to his proposal based on the continued deterioration of the molding and the hands. Capital Alarm was in Town on Tuesday working on the Town's alarm systems. I put together, reviewed, and sent out the budget report for March and my 1st quarter financial report.

The scenic road hearing for the trees that need to cut to relocate the utility poles for the Turnpike Bridge Project has been scheduled for April 29th. One would hope the scenic road hearing will be straightforward for this project however you should plan to attend if possible to speak in favor of removing the trees. If all goes according to plan, bridge construction should be able to begin by the middle of May. According to John Byatt it does not look like the NEXT beams will lead to a delay, which was a possible concern raised by some contractors at the pre-bid meeting.
